



Road Trip: Atlanta

An Exploration of Race, Privilege, and Justice

Our congregations are engaging more and more in the difficult and necessary conversations about race, privilege and justice. At the outset of 2018, an intergenerational cohort from the synod is invited into deep learning together around these important topics. The cohort will invite participants to read & view media about racial justice and privilege in America, including foundational writings of black theology, contemporary films and essays from a variety of perspectives. The cohort culminates in a trip to Atlanta where we will meet with local faith and nonprofit leaders, visit landmarks of the civil rights movement, share communal meals, and wrestle with what it means to live in this time, and reflect on how God is calling us to work for racial justice. *Facilitated by the Rev.
